English as a Foreign Language - 2012/2013

General English

The General English course is **15 hours per week delivered in the morning**. You will learn English through a balance of activities aimed at improving your grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation and the skills of reading, writing, speaking and listening. Throughout your programme there will be a strong emphasis on English for Communication. You can also prepare for Cambridge exams at an appropriate level. For the college to secure funding for EU students it will be necessary for all students to take a UK based examination as part of their course. You will be given a course book for your core English classes which is included in your tuition fee. You must bring it with you to each class. You will be given an initial assessment to determine which class is most suitable to develop your level and understanding of English. The initial assessment will cover all the skills. You will be given homework and class tests at regular intervals in order to assess and monitor your progress. Mornings are divided into two classes. The first class starts at 9.15am and finishes at 10.45am. The second class starts at 11.00am and end at 12.30pm. The programme has been designed to ensure that every student follows a course of study suitable for their level of competence in English.

English Extra

You can also develop your English Language ability and then learn new skills to put your language into practice. You can choose 2 extra subjects **in addition to your General English classes**. Each option is five hours per week. Subjects are studied in the afternoon between 13.30 and 16.15. One subject is two afternoons of 2.5 hours each. You can choose a maximum of 2 subjects. Choose from a whole range of options which can include:

The course fees DO NOT include accommodation or living costs, airport transfers, any additional examinations or any part time courses you choose to take. In order to be eligible for these fees you must maintain full attendance. Included in your tuition fees is access to Burlington English. This is a unique on-line interactive study course which you can use in preparation for your studies at Chichester College or in conjunction with your studies at College. Burlington English will develop your spoken English, encourage your fluency and confidence, develop your reading and listening skills and also teach and reinforce grammar and vocabulary. Important Information

The minimum age that students will be accepted for study is 16. To qualify for the fees published on this sheet students must be 16 on or before 31st August 2012. If you turn 16 after 31st August 2012 but before the start of the course please contact us to confirm your tuition fees. If you decide to extend your stay at Chichester College you must pay the full balance for the following term in full before starting. A full social programme is available to all international students. Many of its activities are free of charge, however the programme of full day Saturday excursions will be at an additional cost for each trip.

EU Student Definition

You must hold an EU passport and have been resident in the European Economic Area (EEA) and/or the overseas territories for the 3 year period preceding the start of the course. If you are unsure that you meet these criteria please contact us for further assessment.
