## How does this work?

You could choose to study up to 5 subjects using this framework, one from each column. We advise students, depending on their GCSE results to choose 3 or 4 subjects to study. These can not be chosen in the same column, i.e. you could not study Biology and Communication Studies as they are both scheduled to be taught at the same time (in slot B), you could however study Biology (in B) with Geography (in D) and Maths (in A).

## What do I need to study?

You need a minimum of 5 GCSEs grade A\* to C (including English Language, Maths and Science, where appropriate) to be eligible to study on the AS/A level programme. The numbers and combinations of subjects you can choose to study will be dependent on your achievement at GCSE. **Tutorial** - Students studying a full time course will have regular tutorials and one to one meetings with their Student Tutor to support students with their studies. This is a mandatory part of the programme.
