The focus of the morning classes is on general English Language. You will learn English through a balance of activities aimed at improving your grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation and the skills of reading, writing, speaking and listening. Throughout your morning programme there will be a strong emphasis on English for Communication. All EU students will need to do a National Vocational Qualification (NVQ) in English Language, at a level suitable for their ability. The emphasis of this qualification is on being able to use English in practical, realistic situations. You will be given a course book for your core English classes which is included in your tuition fee. You must bring it with you to each class. You will be given an initial assessment to determine which level is most suitable to develop your understanding of English. The initial assessment will cover all the skills. You will be given homework and class tests at regular intervals in order to assess and monitor your progress. There are 2 classes each morning. The first class starts at 9.15am and finishes at 10.45am. The second class starts at 11.00am and finishes at 12.30pm.

Afternoon classes are between 1.30pm and 4.15pm on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, with a fifteen minute break from 2.30pm - 2.45pm.

The programme has been designed to ensure that every student follows a course of study suitable for their level of competence in English.

The Afternoon Course components each represent 5 hours of study per week. They can include:

- Preparation for IELTS
- Preparation for TOEIC
- Anglia Examinations Preparation
- Becoming an English Teacher
- Literature and Media Studies
- Academic Foundation
- ICT
- Air Cabin Crew Services
- English Cookery
- Introduction to Marketing
- Introduction to Travel & Tourism
- Holistic Therapies
- Introduction to Business English
- Advanced Business English
- Grammar, Pronunciation & Communication
- Current Affairs

All courses are subject to a minimum class size and subject to change at any time. Available courses will depend on your level of English and specific courses cannot be guaranteed.

Tuition Fees

7 Weeks study *	£800 *
For less than 7 weeks	£170 per week

* In order to be eligible for these fees you must register for a minimum of 7 weeks, complete a National Vocational Qualification (NVQ) in English and maintain full attendance. For study periods of less than 7 weeks you will be charged full tuition fees.

The course fees include course books for the English language programme, NVQ in English examination entry, College enrolment and registration, and access to our Accommodation Service and International Social Programme. The course fees DO NOT include accommodation or living costs, airport transfers, any additional examinations or any part time courses you choose to take.

Important Information

The minimum age that students will be accepted for study is 16. To qualify for the fees published on this sheet students must be 16 on or before 31st August 2011. If you turn 16 after 31st August 2011 but before the start of the course please contact the International Admissions team to confirm your tuition fees. A full social programme is available to all international students. Many of its activities are free of charge, however the programme of full day Saturday excursions will be at an additional cost for each trip.

EU Student Definition

You must hold an EU passport and have been resident in the European Economic Area (EEA) and/or the overseas territories for the 3 year period preceding the start of the course. If you are unsure that you meet these criteria please contact us for further assessment.
